

It is time for us to say goodbye to Pastor Wayne. He is a passionate, hard-working man that felt truly called to lead us from the first time he met the Lord of Life congregation as an interim pastor over 10 years ago. Pastor Wayne loved this congregation with a level of care that Pastor Joe Tallent also gave us. Even though he lived in Durham that entire 10 years that he served at Lord of Life, he never let the distance be a reason for him not to attend a function at the church. It is something we noticed early in his ministry that he spent MANY more hours at the church than the 15 hours a week that were paid. His pastoral care of our members displayed his deep care for our congregation. We will have a difficult time finding someone with as much passion for us as Wayne Dubnansky had.

Being a teacher by trade, Pastor Wayne excelled at Children's Sermons. He always had a plan for the children's sermon even though we haven't had many children in the past few years. He is remarkable in how quickly he remembers names and is able to insert comments into the sermon of something that had just happened. He has an extremely quick wit. He is ready with a joke at a moment's notice. Pastor Wayne brought a fun and excitement back to the children's sermon. Members of the congregation looked forward to his message and strained to hear what he was saying to the children. He always got down to their level and spoke softly to them, making each child feel special and comfortable.

Pastor Wayne also had a knack for getting people to volunteer for things needed at the church. Few could say no to him when he explained what was needed and he believed that YOU were the person for the task.

We met Pastor Wayne when had agreed to be our Interim Pastor. We were overwhelmed with his immediate love and care for our congregation ... so much so that many in the congregation wanted to call him as our full-time Pastor. Unfortunately at that time, the Interim Pastor signed a contract with the Synod to only serve as an Interim and not be considered for full-time ministry. Pastor Wayne reluctantly honored this contract and went on to serve as Interim Pastor in Rocky Mount and (little) Washington. Retired Lutheran Pastor Bob Kepley told us that Pastor Wayne was gifted with a higher calling than parish ministry. Pastor Wayne has a Master's degree in Education and has worked over 30 years with special needs children. He has a special gift that is able to bring the best out of his students.

Five years later, Pastor Wayne sought Lord of Life again to become our full-time Pastor. When the Call Committee heard that he felt CALLED to serve at Lord of Life, they agreed that he was the one to lead us at that difficult time. All the other candidates were looking for a job. Pastor Wayne wanted to be with US! Recently the Synod changed their policy about calling your Interim Pastor to full-time ministry. I like to think of it as the Wayne Dubnansky clause. Sometimes the right person comes along and you don't always get a second chance.


Pastor Wayne was always involved in the Community Easter Sunrise Service through Garner Area Ministries. It is always nice when members of different communities of faith gather to celebrate the one true God. And it is good to realize that we are not the only believers in Jesus Christ in the area. He also single-handedly manned the table at the community Halloween event at the Lake Benson Park. He would

pass out candy and information about the church at this event. Pastor Wayne also encouraged other community groups to use the church. He became a member of the Garner Rotary, regularly attended the GAST (German-Austrian-Swiss Club of the Triangle) meetings, encouraged Soccer Shots to use our field and facilitated La Voz de Dios and Iglesia Abundante Gracia to worship in our building.

There are so many other small jobs that Pastor Wayne did without asking or thinking. He made the coffee each week and would readily go pick anyone up that needed a ride. Again, he never let distance keep you from worship. He seems to have endless energy! Pastor Wayne has even joined the choir and played the chimes when needed, even though people - not music - is his gift. He is always so willing to pick up whatever is needed. We are so grateful for the time you spent with Lord of Life and pray for Godspeed in the next chapter of your life.


NC Lutheran Synod News

Linda Hash



Neil Brennecke




