Today's festival is a bridge between the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany cycle that comes to a close today and the Lent-Easter cycle that begins in several days. On a high mountain Jesus is revealed as God's beloved Son, echoing the words at his baptism. This vision of glory sustains us as Jesus faces his impending death in Jerusalem. We turn this week to Ash Wednesday and our yearly baptismal journey from lent to Easter. Some churches put aside the alleluia at the conclusion of today's liturgy. This word of joy will be omitted during the penitential season of Lent and will be sung again at Easter.


**A Pancake Supper** will be held in the fellowship hall on February 21<sup>st</sup> at 6 pm.

There will be a freewill offering for World Hunger. Known also as "Mardi Gras", Shrove Tuesday is basically the day of preparation for Lent. The tradition in the church of having pancake suppers and the secular tradition of just plain partying probably derives from the practice of feasting before the fast. It takes place on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday (the first day of Lent.)

Our Ash Wednesday Service will be held on February 22<sup>nd</sup> at 7 pm. Lent consists of the forty days before Easter. In the western Church, we skip over the Sundays when we count the days of Lent, because Sunday is always the joyful celebration of the Resurrection. Therefore, the first day of Lent in the western Church is always a Wednesday.
