



After breakfast the participants join us in the fellowship for each one to introduce his/her mom or caregiver. I don't know who is more excited for the day – the moms or their children.



Do you recognize me as a child of God?

Your life is a journey you must travel with a deep consciousness of God. It cost God plenty to get you out of that dead-end, empty-headed life you grew up in. It keeps growing, even while we are watching it and being careful about our actions. We sin every day. Hopefully not the same sin! But sin separates us from God. So ask God to show you the sin, repent and return to God. He is safe! He will comfort you and the Holy Spirit will be your conscience and guide through your daily struggles. Once beautiful wildflowers will wither and die. So will your worldly body. Fortunately, God has a new spiritual body ready and waiting for you. God's Word never ends! Hallelujah! We can rejoice and be glad in this fact.

So back to my original question....do you recognize me as a Child of God? We all have work to do. We can do better! Continue to pray, read the Word, and put yourself in the company of fellow believers. We are all a work in progress. Make yourself available to God for his correction!
