
We will gather in the sanctuary at 9 am beginning on August 4th. We would love to have you join us! It is a no-commitment way to try out the choir.

LOL/CTK COVENANT TO BE SIGNED JULY 10

Our ministry partners at Christ the King Lutheran Church, 600 Walnut Street in Cary, invite Lord of Life members and friends to join them for dinner on Wednesday, July 10, 5:45 pm. It is the first of their "Wine & Word" summer series, and participants are invited to bring their favorite wine to share. During dinner, the pastors and council presidents of our two churches will ceremoniously sign the "Covenant of Collaboration" which spells out the relationship between LOL and CTK during the three-year process of ministry revitalization.



Here is the text of the Covenant:

In thanksgiving to God and the conviction that the Holy Spirit is calling us into a season of growth and mission advancement together, Christ the King Lutheran Church (CTK) and Lord of Life Lutheran Church (LOL) enter into this three-year COVENANT OF COLLABORATION in which CTK will come alongside LOL, providing resources and guidance.

As part of this COLLABORATION, we will

1. Pray for one another regularly and publicly;

2. Encourage members of both congregations to join Pastor Wolfgang's Prayer Partners Network;

3. Develop a "Dreams & Visions Team" (Joel 28:2) consisting of three persons each from CTK and LOL which will guide the development and implementation of the missional plan;

4. Plan for a joint meeting/social gathering for LOL and CTK Congregational Councils at least annually;

5. Encourage CTK members who live in or near Garner and others who wish to do so to become LOL associate members for a period of time (1-3 years), providing human and financial resources <u>in addition</u> to their commitments to CTK;

6. Invite the CTK senior pastor to preach at LOL at least annually;

7. Open specific programs at CTK to LOL members (examples may include: baptism and communion classes, specific confirmation classes, online bible studies, affinity groups such as Men's Pub Ministry and Sewing Sisters, etc.);

8. Provide financial support from CTK for three years at \$10K/year

9. Provide consultation and support in all areas of ministry, especially vision casting, evangelism, worship, stewardship, technology, and facilities management through sharing expertise by CTK staff, leadership and volunteers;

10. Coordinate ELCA support through the NC Synod office.

Part of the covenant is financial support from the ministry partners which has now been approved: \$25,000 from the Church-Wide offices of the ELCA; \$20,000 from the Casey-Peeler Fund of the North Carolina Synod; \$10,000 from CTK, and an additional \$5,000 through the office of Pastor Danielle DeNise, director for evangelical mission and assistant to the bishop in the NC Synod.

Lord of Life member Bob DeVito attended the Garner Citizens Police Academy from March through early June 2024 and recently graduated from the academy.

The academy aims to familiarize residents with the workings of the local police department. It provides an opportunity to meet community officers and gain insight into the role of a police officer in Garner today. The academy also seeks to strengthen the bond between officers and the community by fostering a better understanding of police duties and functions. It serves as a platform for sharing feedback and suggestions for improvement. Each week, members of the department lead discussions on various topics.

Upon graduation, attendees have the option to apply to be volunteers with the CAPT Team, which assists the police at special events.

Bob's next endeavor is with the Garner Citizens Fire Academy, with graduation set for July 29th.

Third Time Is A Charm!

Several years ago, the NC Synod voted to alternate Synod Assembly with Synod Gatherings. The first one was canceled due to Covid. The second one was a hybrid- virtual and in person. This year, ALL in person. It is always a joy to meet new Lutheran across the state and catch up with old friends. I wish everyone could have been there!

We had 2 keynote speakers – one on Thursday and one on Friday. Both gave very moving speeches; inviting us to DO something! Both encouraged us to look at the world around us and quit trying to conform the world to our worship space. We need to find a way to engage those who are searching for "something."

Many young adults admit that "Life" is harder than expected. The United States has a generation of young people that were not brought up in the church. So the thought of finding your purpose or a meaningful relationship or any kind of connection at church does not cross their mind! Our main message to these searching people is that God loves you, just as you are, right now! And you matter! Pastor Wolfgang reminds us that we need radical hospitality. Invite them to church and then be kind to them. Ask follow up questions, like how is work? Did you find a dentist? A doctor that you like? How was your vacation? How was your move? How can we help you?

The church is a resource for help and relationships. This is a well-kept secret. What can you do to spread this message. How can we make a better connection with members within our church and visitors? What are we trying to learn and who do we hope to learn from? All of these questions and actions start with Empathy.

There will be a relook at our Human Sexuality Social Statement in the coming year. There is a draft currently available on the ELCA website. Congregations are encouraged to have discussion groups and readings of this document. Phase 1 is currently underway, where the language has been reviewed and updated. The new Social Statement will be voted on at the 2025 Church-Wide Assembly.

The Theme for the Synod Gathering is "We are More". We are better together and are a pretty strong group when we come together. Bishop Tim gave his annual reflections. This lecture is recorded on the NC Lutheran website. He actually posts a monthly reflection, that you can also find on the website. His focus for the NC Synod has been:

> Faith Formation Mission and Outreach Leadership Development Congregational Vitality Inclusion and Diversity Stewardship Collaboration and partnership.

Bishop Tim has three more years to serve as the NC Bishop. Then we will choose a new Bishop. 2027 Synod Assembly will be very exciting!!!!

Synod means to "walk together". And that is what we are doing. Walking through this life together, trying to pool our resources and address as many community needs as possible.

The Bishop's Challenge last year at Synod Assembly was for 70% of our North Carolina congregations to actively engage in refugee resettlement over the next 18 months. Currently we have 138 of the 197 congregations engage in refugees. The average refugee spends 6-9 years in a refugee camp before making it to the United States.

The 2024 Youth Gathering will be in New Orleans this year. North Carolina has 282 youth registered to attend this Gathering next month. We have over 500 vacancies for ELCA Pastors or Deacons in the US. There will be 173 Seminary graduates in the US this year. Not enough to fill all the vacancies! So the program to increase the responsibility of Lay Preachers has taken off. SAMs or Synodical Authorized Ministers are called to a specific place for a specific time. The SAMs have special training through the NC ELCA Lutheran office that lasts around 18 months. They are trained to provide Word and Sacrament.

Bishop Tim taught us that everyone in Palestine is a Semite. A Semite is someone that speaks Arabic or Hebrew. The word Semite has been misused in our current vocabulary. The NC Synod has an Arabic speaking mission congregation in Charlotte... St Francis Lutheran Church. They currently meet in the chapel at Morning Star Lutheran Church.

And Lutheran Seminary is moving from Columbia, South Carolina to Hickory, North Carolina. It will officially be joined with Lenoir Rhyne University. Currently, many professors teach at both schools. LTSS and LRU merged 12 years ago to reduce costs for both campuses. But current times see that 80% of seminary students are online nationally. There are only 6 seminary students living on campus in Columbia. They just don't need the housing and those costs are high.

The Church-wide Assembly will be held in Phoenix, Arizona from July 28-August 3rd. A Presiding Bishop and Secretary will be selected. The Civic Life and Faith Social Statement will be voted on at this Assembly.

There is a Commission of the Renewed Lutheran Church. More to come on this. It considers three expressions of the church: congregation, synod and church wide.

I attended a workshop called the Scrappy Church. The Pastor leading this session didn't like the title. It was given to her. She was called to a failing congregation and was told by her governing body to close the congregation. She found many reasons to keep the congregation going when she arrived and adopted two other nearby congregations near Ocala, Florida eight years ago. All three congregations are now thriving. And that is what she wanted to talk about. To find something that makes your congregation unique and build on that. Small congregations are essential to spread the Word. Large church game plans do not work for small congregations. Isaiah 43:19 says that God is doing a new thing! Lord of Life is currently in the midst of a new thing. And Hallelujah! Isn't it wonderful!



Small churches have to remember that God gives you everything that you need. If only one person volunteers for a project or committee, thank God that one person volunteered. Instead of complaining that few people are at worship each week, thank God for the ones that are there. Celebrate them! Love on them! God will always give us enough. When you have a fear of working out of your scarcity, then you WILL decline! God has a purpose for everything. And the Holy Spirit is in charge of growing the church. Can't you feel the Holy Spirit when you come to church on Sunday?!! Focus on meeting the community instead of worrying about paying the bills. And it is okay for people to have more than one church. Jerry Hart has two churches; has for years. Thank you for your faithfulness to both congregations! Listen to where the Holy Spirit is leading you. God's ideas never fail! When WE fail, we learn from that failure and get up and go again. Go to the community and ask what they need. This is what we are doing at LOL with the Three Great Listenings... listen to God, listen to each other, listen to the community. A need or a problem leads to an opportunity for LOL to serve!

The 2025 NC Synod Assembly will be held May 29-31st. Location TBD, but probably not Lenoir Rhyne. The University is not big enough to house everyone. We will be sending voting delegates from Lord of Life. So be thinking NOW if you would like to be one of those people!!! I've been a delegate several times and would be glad to answer any questions you might have.

Parting words – Be authentic.

God will meet us where we are.

God created me and you in profound love.

God knows me better than I know myself.

Live in God's love.

God makes us diverse and unique. Can you hear the Holy Spirit calling you? Leading you in a new direction?
